EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

1. Shri Neiphiu Rio, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Nagaland convened a High Level meeting at Secretariat in view of CORONAVIRUS Outbreak on the 16th March, 2020 and subsequently, it is announced to close down all the Educational institutions for the safety of the students from 17th March, 2020 to 12th April, 2020 which is extended till further order.
2. MITE started online classes just after the closure of the Colleges and became the first College amongst all the B.Ed Colleges in Nagaland to start online classes.
3. Due to timely start of online classes, the syllabus had been covered by May 15, 2020 and online Pre- Semester examination was conducted on May 19, 2020 for Sem-4 and from May 18-23, 2020 for Sem-2. The Result for Sem-4 was declared on May 22, 2020 and that of Sem-2 on May 25, 2020.
4. Mock-Tests are frequently conducted by the concerned Faculty.
5. Special cares are taken for the Non-Collegiate candidates for remedial classes by the Faculty.
6. Mentoring and Remedial classes are being continued by the concerned Faculty.
7. Block Teaching and Internship for few days until the closure of Schools were done successfully by the Student Teachers of Semester-4.
8. The Faculty Members organize IDD (Inter- Disciplinary Discussions) fortnightly where one Faculty member presents the topic on his/her choice as a Resource person and the rest of the faculty members participate the program. The Question –Answer session takes place. Each of the Faculty members is placed in the Time Table framed by the Principal for their turn as a Resource Person.
9. On the occasion of the Word Environment Day on 5th June 2020, a virtual competition on painting and photography was organized by MITE.
10. On the occasion of the Word No Tobacco Day on 31st May, 2020, a virtual competition on painting was organized by the Dept of Health and Family Welfare, Govt of Nagaland where Mr Keyolel Zhale, BEd 2018-20 bearing Roll no 10 has participated and awarded with a gift hamper and a certificate.
11. MITE has opened free G-SUITE Account on Education where the emails under G-SUITE Account have been generated for all the Student-Teachers, Teacher-Educators and Non-Teaching staff and the student teachers are advised to use the G-SUITE for their Mock test and End Semester Examination, June-2020.
12. A mock test has been scheduled and will commence on Sept 11, 2020 for Semester-2 and Sep 15, 2020 for Semester-4 to avoid the problems expected during End Semester Exam.
13. End-Semester Exam for Semester -4 will commence on Sept 28, 2020 and that of Semester-2 on Sept 29, 2020 through online. First time, 5-Hrs duration has been allotted by the Nagaland University to conduct the End Semester Examination .This Five hours has been split-up into two parts as 3 Hrs and 2 Hrs. Three hours are allotted for writing the Exam and two hours for downloading the question paper and uploading the Answer sheets in PDF format.
14. Each of the Six Clubs has organised virtual Morning Assembly weekly on Monday at 9:00 am with a lot of innovations and the Motivational speech by the Principal during the lockdown period.
15. Dr. Kate Dandesh Kumar, Associate Professor, MITE tied a knot with Mahalakshmi on 6th August, 2020 at 9:00am at Manish Function Hall, Rajahmundry, Andhra Pradesh. The Literary Club wishes all the best for their new journey of life.
16. A 2-Day National Webinar on National Education Policy-2020: Strategies, Issues and Challenges will be organised by MITE, Kohima through Cisco Webex online platform on Sept 21-22, 2020. Prof K P Subba Rao, Project Director, ICSSR IMPRESS, Dept of Education, Andhra University, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh has consented to be the Speaker for Inaugural Address and Key-Notes. The Valedictory Speech will be delivered by Dr Devanand Sinha, Principal, MITE. The Chief Patron of the Webinar is Mr Pelee Hekha, Managing Director, MITE. ARTICLE - 3

MATHEMATICS CORNER

GIVE ME YOUR BRAIN FOR A WHILE-4
VEDIC MATHEMATICS TO MULTIPLY TWO DIGIT NUMBERS
IF THE DIGITS ON THE TEN'S PLACE ARE THE SAME AND
SUM OF UNIT'S PLACE DIGITS IS 10

The suitable examples are such as:

1. 65×65
2. 36×34
3. 46×44 etc.

In the example 1, ten's place digits are the same and equal to 6 and sum of the units place digit $5+5=10$.

In the example 2, ten's place digits are the same and equal to 3 and sum of the units place digit $6+4=10$.

In the example 3, ten's place digits are the same and equal to 4 and sum of the units place digit $6+4=10$.

Let's solve the example 1.

We use the following steps:

- a) We first multiply the unit's place digits and get $5 \times 5 = 25$.
- b) We add 1 to the ten's place digit 6 and get 7.
- c) We multiply 6 by 7 and get 42.
- d) Finally, we write 4225 from steps a and c.
- e) The required result is 4225.

Hence, $65 \times 65 = 4225$.

Let's solve the example 2.

We use the following steps:

- a) We first multiply the unit's place digits and get $6 \times 4 = 24$.
- b) We add 1 to the ten's place digit 3 and get 4.
- c) We multiply 3 by 4 and get 12.
- d) Finally, we write 1224 from steps a and c.
- e) The required result is 1224.

Hence, $36 \times 34 = 1224$.

Let's solve the example 3.

We use the following steps:

- a) We first multiply the unit's place digits and get $6 \times 4 = 24$.
- b) We add 1 to the ten's place digit 4 and get 5.
- c) We multiply 4 by 5 and get 20.
- d) Finally, we write 2024 from steps a and c.
- e) The required result is 2024.

Hence, $46 \times 44 = 2024$

Now, give me your brain for a while to multiply 69 and 61.
