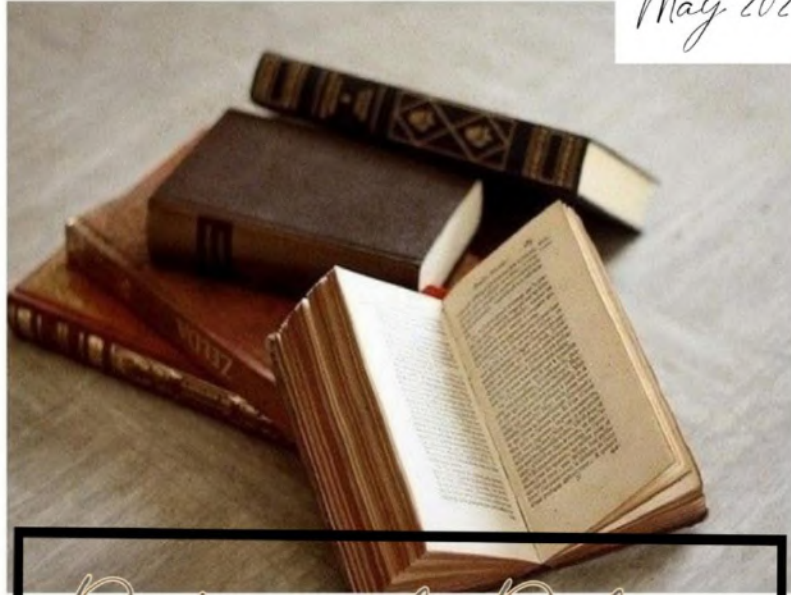


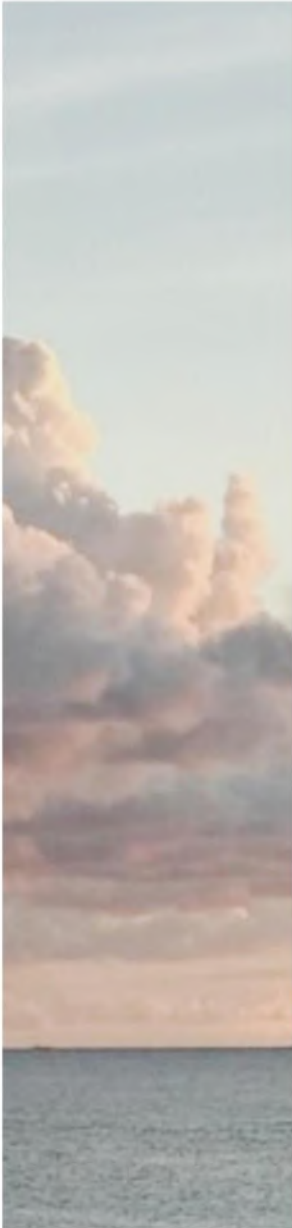

March 5: Pope Francis became the first Pope to visit Iraq. Pope Francis's visit to Iraq took place between 5 March and 8 March 2021. The visit was remembered as an attempt to mend bridges between the different faiths in Iraq.

Mar 14: 63rd Grammy Awards: Beyoncé breaks record for most Grammys won by a singer (28), Taylor Swift win Album of the Year and Billie Eilish Record of the Year.

Mar 2: First ever tweet by Twitter founder Jack Dorsey "just setting up my twttr" sells for \$2.9 million in digitally autographed version.

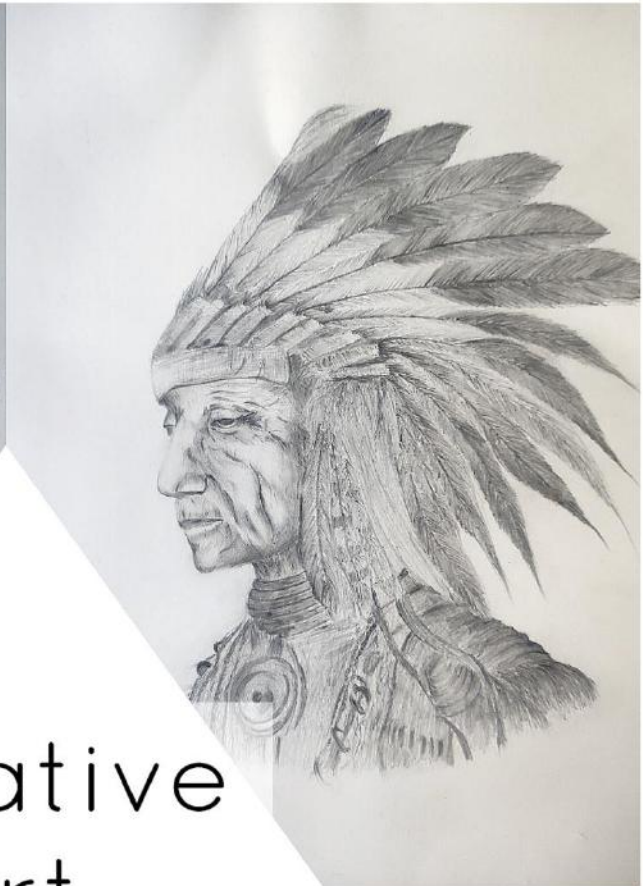
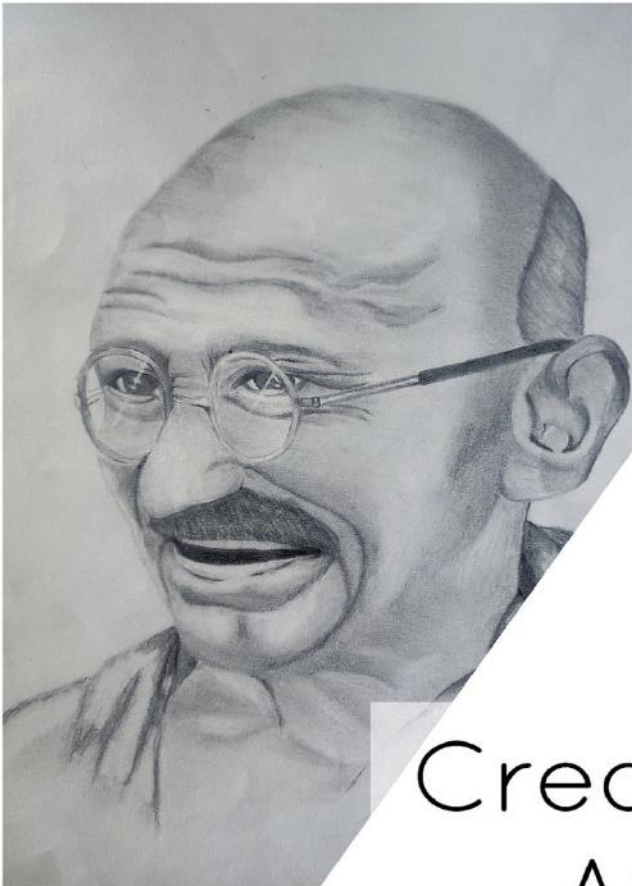
Apr 5: India records over 100,000 new COVID cases for the first time, more than half in the state of Maharashtra, which begins a new lockdown.

Apr 12: Great Britain loosens its COVID-19 restrictions, opening pubs and shops after 175 days, the world's longest period of restrictions.

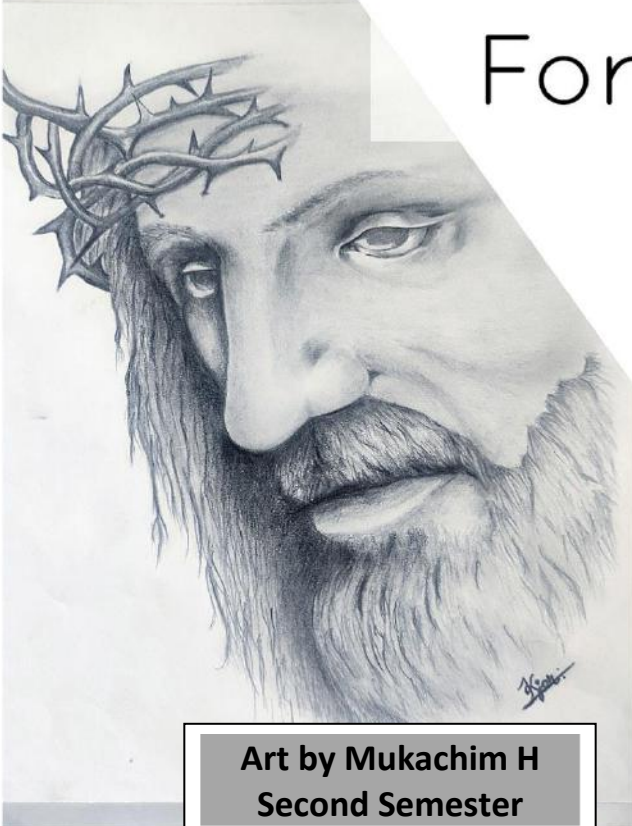
Apr 14: US President Biden says "It's time to end America's longest war" confirming his decision to withdraw all US troops from Afghanistan by Sept 11.

Our educational system should be thoroughly investigated or evaluated.

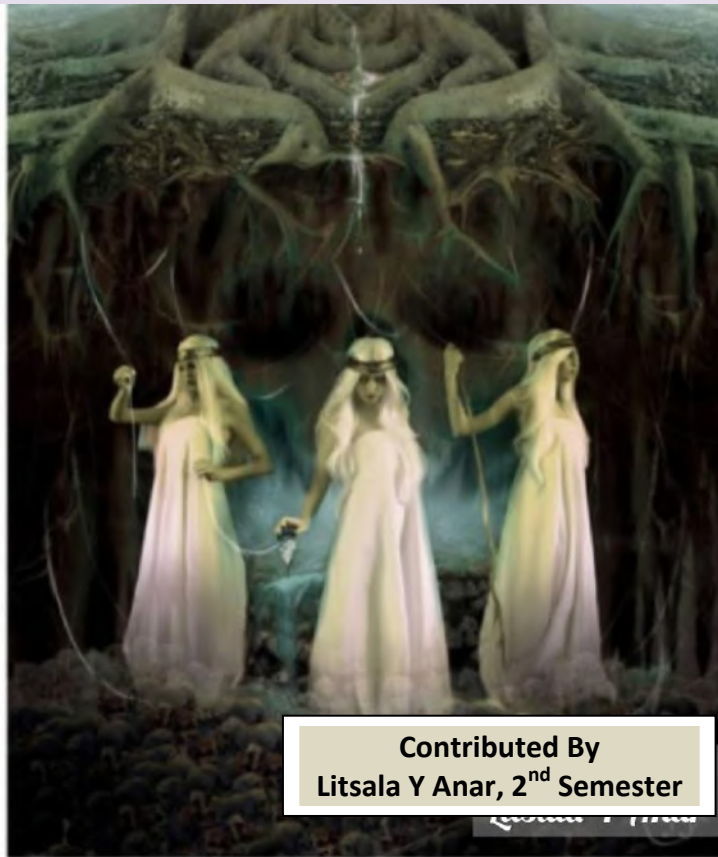
It should not just provide bookish knowledge infested with so much junks of unnecessary curriculum but it should help the nation grow, and develop globally.
